



# COVID-19 Camping MAKA safety protocol

With this flyer, we would like to inform you about the rules regarding COVID-19. We follow the rules ordered by the Belgian and local authorities.

The virus mainly spreads through sneezing and cough drops that hang in the air briefly and can survive on all kinds of materials for a while. Outside the body, however, the virus only survives for a short time, so anyone who shows no symptoms is hardly a risk of infection.

It is important to follow the standard measures for a "normal flu" and a cold so as not to infect anyone in your vicinity.

The sanitary building, the reception and other "hand contact points" on the campsite are disinfected several times a day. The rental facilities and your key are also thoroughly cleaned and aired before you, as the next tenant, can enter. Rental facilities are rented to no more than one household.

Visits and visits are not allowed.

The door of the sanitary must serve open due to continuous ventilation of these areas.

Children up to the age of 9 must go to the sanitary block accompanied by an adult from the same family.

It is recommended to wear gloves with the waste containers.

The entire campsite, on the playground equipment and outside the campsite, you need to keep 1.5 meters away from everyone from 13 years old.

Disinfect your hands before entering the sanitary building, wash them after using the sanitary building and wash them again at your camping pitch.

There is no maximum number of people to use the sanitary building, but you must keep to the rule of 1.5 meters.

Respect the closed sinks, closed urinals, closed showers, etc.

Maximum 1 person at a time in the reception.

Also keep 1.5 meters distance at the campfire sites if you are not all from one family.

No greetings with hand, kiss, hug, etc.

Wash your hands regularly with soap and water for longer than 25 seconds.

Cough or sneeze into your elbow or into a tissue that is thrown away right away. Keep in mind that everything you touch is also touched by someone else and therefore poses a risk of infection to yourself and others.

A mouth mask does not protect you, but is a precautionary measure to protect the others against sneezing, coughing, coughing. Wearing this is recommended if the 1.5 meter cannot be respected.

People with complaints should immediately leave the campsite and report this to us immediately! In addition, have a doctor consult you immediately.

People who do not follow the general government guidelines and the guidelines of Camping MAKA are requested to leave the campsite immediately. We are expected to enforce the rules and count on your full cooperation.

**Keep a meter and a half away from people who do not come from your own family, 1.5 meters is not possible, then wear a mouth mask.**
